Pros:

- Prototypical size with great strength
- Very athletic, moves well and is agile
- Great accuracy, spins the ball well
- Good arm strength
- Very quick release
- Quick decision-maker
- Very good footwork
- Gritty confident kid, gunslinger
- Willing to throw into tight spaces
- Can throw players open
- Ran NFL style offense

Cons:

- Arm strength is good, not great
- Broke a bone in his wrist last year
- Level of competition questions
- Can lock onto a target occasionally
- Sometimes tries to throw into too tight of a window

Carson Wentz is the prototype NFL quarterback in 2016. He's smart, athletic, tall and strong. There are very few things to dislike about Wentz, despite his small school pedigree. Wentz simply does just about everything right. He's got a great release with no wasted motion, he keeps the ball high and tight, ready to throw, and delivers the ball with good velocity. Some will cite him for having just average arm strength but there's a difference between having the strongest arm, and having good arm strength. Wentz definitely has enough power in his right arm to make every NFL throw. He ran a pro-style offense at North Dakota State and has time to develop nuance to his game. He's adept at play action fakes, bootlegs, taking snaps from under center and more. While his footwork is very good, he does tend to get a bit wide in his stance, which limits his ability to throw with power and accuracy occasionally. Wentz will be a pro bowl quarterback if he lands in the right situation and should be the first player taken in 2016.
