Pros:

- Great vertical threat
- Moves at line are impressive
- Elusive and hard to put hands on
- Makes tough catches
- Explosive runner, great acceleration
- Run after catch skills are good
- Gets free on underneath routes
- Great concentration on deep balls
- Incredible leaping ability

Cons:

- Small frame, not strong
- Baylor offense
- Takes plays off that he's not involved in
- Knows few routes on the route tree
- Short arms
- Body catcher who had drops
- Afraid to go over middle

Corey Coleman is working from the same disadvantage that most Baylor receivers are; their college offense. Baylor runs a pure spread system that simply does not ask it's wide outs to run many routes. There is very little nuisance to his game at the moment and he doesn't show the fundamentals to run a lot of intermediate routes at the next level. That being said, Coleman is one of the best deep threats in this draft class. He has world class speed and acceleration. If a team needs a slot receiver or runs a vertical concept, he's the player for them. Coleman doesn't have great size and he doesn't work well over the middle but he could develop into a solid 2nd or third option in an offense early in his career. Will be relied up on early because of his draft position (likely 1st round) but he won't be ready for some time.
