Lucas is the most physically talented cornerback to come out of Penn State in quite some time. He's explosive, quick, and has good long speed. While he possesses good size, he doesn't play as big as he is. He struggled in his transition to safety his senior year. It is clear by his skill set that Lucas is a natural corner. He doesn't have long arms, but he's got quick feet, fluid hips and he can mirror just about any receiver. His problem comes with the ball in the air. Lucas struggles to make plays on the ball and has limited production when it comes to breakups and interceptions. His instincts of when to break on the ball are limited and he's conservative in his approach to taking chances on the ball. Despite that he has a future in the NFL has a slot corner. While he's not a good tackler for a safety, he plays with effort and intensity and is a good fit in a nickel defense. While his ball skills will have to improve, he's a good technician and could see playing time early in his career. Mid round pick with great value.
