Summary: Redshirt Senior Dan Feeney is one of the most decorated prospects in the 2017 NFL Draft. He's a two-time All-American including AP 1st team honors this past year. Feeney is also a two-time captain at Indiana and a steady force for the Hoosiers for the past five years. Feeney has started 46 games in his career at Indiana and has only been credited with two sacks the entire time, including when he was pressed into duty at right tackle for the finals five games of his career this year. Feeney is a technician of an offensive linemen, with great posture in run and pass blocking, good hand fighting, and overall, excellent technique. He does a great job gaining the proper shoulder on zone blocking schemes, as well as flipping his hips on reach blocks to seal the hole or set the edge. He's flexible, athletic and has good power. There aren't too many weak points to Feeney's game. The question about the Orland Park, Ill, native is whether or not he's reached his ceiling as a football player. He's strong and holds up well at the point of attack, but he doesn't really move players in the running game. That is partially due to the system he was in at Illinois, but Feeney simply doesn't have elite power or explosion. Feeney is listed at 6'4" but looks shorter than that on film. The question is not whether Feeney will start in the NFL, it's if he will be a consistent All-Pro. He's worthy of a late first round draft pick for a team who needs to upgrade the athleticism, character and leadership on their offensive line.
